How It All Started

Safety Concerns to Look For

Playgrounds

- Broken or burnt slides
- Chains or ropes tied to the structure
- Is the surfacing adequate?
- Missing bolts
- ♦ Worn "S" hooks

Parks

- ♦ Broken/missing valve box lids
- ♦ Water blow outs around irrigation heads
- Broken/hanging tree branches
- ♦ Trip hazards along sidewalk
- Missing electrical outlet covers

Playground Injury Statistics

- ♦ 200,000 children ages 14 and younger end up in the hospital with injuries associated with playground equipment.
 - ♦ These injuries include:
 - ♦ Severe-fractures
 - ♦ Internal injuries
 - ♦ Concussions
 - ♦ Dislocations
 - ♦ Amputation
 - ♦ More than 20,000 of these children are treated for traumatic brain injury.

Tips to Stay S.A.F.E.

♦ S=Supervision

♦ Make sure signage is update explaining "supervision required."

♦ A=Age Appropriate Equipment

♦ Every play structure is rated for a specific age group. 2-5 year old children or 5-12 year old children. Make sure your signage clearly states the age group for that play structure.

♦ F=Fall Surfacing

♦ Fall heights are different for each play structure. The amount of surfacing needed is based off of the highest designated playing surface.

♦ E=Equipment Maintenance

♦ Frequently maintained playground equipment will significantly reduce the chances of a child being injured on the play structure.
